Reflections on Gun Violence:

As we know gun violence has not lessened despite the horrendous events in schools, houses of worship, supermarkets, etc. Some of you might be aware that the day the General Convention was about to start, a man was shot and killed right outside of the hotel. The bishops and deputies during the convention marched together through the area where the shooting occurred, calling for an end to gun violence. Some members of our own parish during the month of June held silent prayer vigils outside of the library here in the village of Fairport. Many of us are tired of seeing our children shot or killed in the city streets and innocent lives shattered. It is easy to feel overwhelmed and become numbed by it all. Help us to find new ways to have our voices and those voices of the countless victims of gun violence be heard.

Transitions:

Just a gentle note that whenever someone leaves us as an employee, or is hired anew, there is a dynamic called "transition" which is endemic to our life as a parish. Things change. Positions change. People change. Inevitably, we seek to have things remain the same. Yet, by the very nature of change they cannot. The same dynamic applies to vestries and any other ministry that leadership cycles in and out. It is important for us to celebrate the gifts of the person who has contributed to



our life and to the new person who is coming on. At times, there is a very healthy gap between the one leaving and the one beginning anew. This vacuum is not a time to panic, but rather a good time to experience gratitude. For ourselves we have transition happening in our church office, as a diocese we are in the process of transition with the position of our bishop. May we find ourselves immersed in gratitude for what has been and openness for what will be.
